RE: Two-Way Radios

The two-way radio system on your project is one of many being set up throughout Louisiana. They are all liscensed by the FCC (Foderal Communications Commission) under the call letters KUY-2124.

The FCC has strict rules and regulations for the usage of these radios and they are monitored frequently for any violations. THESE RADIOS ARE NOT A PLAYTHING and it is important that these rules be adhered to, as any violation by any base station or mobile unit can cause the liscense to be revoked, which would immobilize radios throughout the state.

FCC REGULATIONS

- 1. DO NOT use vulgar or profese language on the air.
- 2. DO NOT tie up the radio for more than three (3) minutes at a time.
- . This is a business channel and we are sharing this channel with two other organizations.
- 3. Relinquish the channel immediately if another station breaks in with an emergency call. (By the way, the code call for emergency is "May Day"), this may or may not be used.
- 4. DO NOT break in on a conversation unless it is an absolute emergency.
- 5. DO NOT use the radio for bullshit conversations, as it has been stated before, this is a business channel.
- 6. You MUST give your call letters (KUY-2124) when originating a call.

RADIC OPERATING PROCEDURES

"Alfred" code. (See chart below). For instance, Jonesboro would be KUY-2124 Butler base! Mobile units at their home base will be designated as Mobile I, Mobile II, etc. A Mobile unit away from its home base will take on the name of its base. Example: A Mobile unit from Bogalusa while traveling in the Pt. Coupee area would originate a call thusly:

"This is KUY-2124 Green mobile calling Franklin base, come in, Franklin."

When originating a call, you must give your call letters, code name and the name of the base station or mobile unit which you are calling.

Example: base; "This is KUY-2124 Green base calling mobile unit "one", over.

mobile; "This is mobile unit "the", come in base, over.

At the end of the conversation, (not to exceed three minutes) you again give your call letters and "clear your station". Example:

Base: "This is KUY-2124 Groen base, clear."

Mobile: "This is KUY-2124 mobile I, clear."
