Dear Sir and Brother:

At this very moment the entire nation is aroused and disturbed by the brutal murder of Harry T. Moore, State Coordinator for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People in Florida, who died as a result of a bomb blast which wrecked his home and also seriously injured his wife on Christmas Night.

This killing of the NAACP official is a continuation of the recent pattern of terror in Florida, including the bombing of Jewish Synagogues and Centers, the bombing of a Negro Housing Project, and the attempted bombing of a Catholic Church.

NAACP leader, Harry T. Moore, was murdered in Florida because he spear-headed the fight to defend the innocent victims of lynch law and mob violence. Throughout the Nation a series of memorial mass meetings will take place on Sunday Afternoon, January 6th. On that day in 61 cities throughout America many thousands of people of all races and creeds will gather together under the auspices of the NAACP to express their identification with the continuing fight to realize the ideals of democracy and social justice for all Americans.

On Sunday, January 6th at 3 p.m. at Mt. Olivet Baptist Church, 120th Street at Lenox Avenue the New York memorial meeting will take place. Addressing this meeting will be Walter White, who will present the results of his on-the-spot investigation, Thurgood Marshall, Charles S. Zimmerman, Manager of the Dressmaker's Union Local 22 of the International Ladies Garment Workers Union of America and Hubert Warner, Vice-President of the National Maritime Union, C.I.O.

It is most important that there be a large scale participation of trade unionists in the New York protest meeting. We urgently request that the officers of your union notify the membership of this meeting.

FACT SHEET ON HARRY T. MOORE

Harry T. Moore, State Coordinator of NAACP Branches in Florida, was killed as the result of a bomb blast which wrecked his home in Mims, Florida on Christmas night. His wife, Mrs. Hamiet Moore was seriously injured and died on January 3. Mr. Moore's death came less than two months after Samuel Shepherd was killed and Walter Irvin (defendants in the Groveland Case) was seriously wounded by Sheriff Willis McCall while they were being brought from the penitentiary to Lake County for re-trial as ordered by the U. S. Supreme Court.


Mr. Moore had been spearheading the campaign throughout Florida to bring about the indictment and prosecution of McCall. He had served as executive secretary of the Florida State Conference NAACP from 1946 to 1951. From 1939 to 1946, he was State President, and prior to 1939 he had been an officer and leader of the Brevard County (Fla.) Branch.

Mr. Moore was also executive secretary of the Progressive Voters League of Florida (no connection with the Progressive Party), which was organized primarily to stimulate registration and voting among Negroes and to secure unrestricted use of the ballot.

In his position as Executive Secretary and officer of the State Conference, Mr. Moore fought for equalization of teachers' salaries; attacked mob violence and police brutality, and conducted many investigations of injustices suffered by colored people throughout the State.

The NAACP has offered a reward of \$5,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the Moore murderers. Demands have been made upon the Department of Justice for a special grand jury in the case.
