

VOTE ON NOVEMBER 8

All voters will get a long paper ballot on November 8. On it we will vote for some MEN and some CHANGES to the Constitution.

The MEN - We'll be voting for a SENATOR and a CONGRESSMAN.

MARK X FOR WHITLEY FOR SENATE

Rev. Whitley of Rust College, Holly Springs, is running for SENATE. As a FREEDOM CANDIDATE, Whitley wants to be the voice of the poor; he knows what it is to be poor. He also knows what it is to be black.

MARK X FOR DRUMMOND FOR CONGRESS

Doc Drummond, a plumber from Kosciusko, is running for Congress from the first District. He will work for better schools for all children, good anti-poverty programs, and laws that will really help poor people.

The CHANGES - The two changes are a MERGING COUNTIES AMENDMENT and the MORE THAN ONE TERM AMENDMENT.

VOTE AGAINST 'MERGING COUNTIES' AMENDMENT

This would give the man in Jackson the power to join our county together with another county. Right now we, the voters, are the only ones with that power. Keep our power. Mark X AGAINST.

VOTE AGAINST 'MORE THAN ONE TERM' AMENDMENT

This change would let the man we elect as state auditor serve more than one term in a row. Right now no state official can serve more than one term in a row. Keep one-term offices. Mark X AGAINST.

Vote AGAINST the Amendments.

We will be voting on whether or not to amend the State Constitution. To amend means to change.

There are two different changes that the men in Jackson want to make.

BUT - before they can change the Constitution, WE, THE VOTERS, MUST DECIDE.

On November 8th the two changes will be on our ballot. After each change there will be a place for each voter to mark -
FOR the amendment.....(..)
AGAINST the amendment...(..)

MARK your X AGAINST Both.

HOW TO VOTE - Instructions for NEW VOTERS

- (1) GO TO THE POLLING PLACE IN YOUR PRECINCT (Probably closest to your home.)
- (2) TELL THE OFFICIALS YOUR NAME AND SIGN THEIR BOOK. IF YOU CANNOT SIGN, MAKE YOUR MARK. EVEN IF YOU CANNOT WRITE, YOU CAN VOTE.
- (3) GET A BALLOT FROM THE OFFICIALS.
- (4) TAKE THE BALLOT TO A PRIVATE PLACE IN THE ROOM. NO ONE HAS THE RIGHT TO WATCH HOW YOU VOTE.
- (5) MARK YOUR BALLOT WITH X MARKS IN THE SPACES BESIDE THE MEN YOU WANT TO VOTE FOR AND IF YOU ARE FOR OR AGAINST THE AMENDMENTS. (SEE HOW THE SAMPLE BALLOT ON THE FRONT OF THIS PAPER IS MARKED.) IF YOU CANNOT READ, ASK THE OFFICIALS FOR HELP. EVEN IF YOU CAN NOT READ, YOU CAN VOTE.
- (6) FOLD YOUR BALLOT SO THAT THE MARKS YOU MADE DO NOT SHOW. NO ONE HAS THE RIGHT TO SEE YOUR MARKED BALLOT. PUT YOUR MARKED BALLOT IN THE BALLOT BOX.
