

BOOZE BOYCOTT

For the first time since Steinbeck wrote *Grapes of Wrath*, there is a massive farm strike in California. Grape pickers in Tulare and Kern Counties have been out for two months. They are demanding \$1.40 an hour and 25¢ a box. Their strike is a crucial development in the effort to end the poverty and disenfranchisement which is the lot of millions of Americans.

The National Farm Workers Association and the Agricultural Workers Organizing Comm. (AFL-CIO) have called for a nationwide boycott of Roma Wines - made by scab labor employed by Schenley Industries. SDS and SNCC are responding to that call by organizing informational pickets at chain liquor outlets, Schenly offices, and other places where Roma is sold or distributed all over the country.

This Saturday, December 11, 10:00 A.M., at the SDS office there will be a meeting led by Dolores Huerta of the NFWA to begin discussing plans for the boycott and student participation as a whole in the fight against agribusiness. Also at the same meeting, SDS and civil rights people from Pasadena will meet to work out a protest against the prejudiced selection of the Rose "Queen" (not one Negro girl ever).

The rest of the afternoon and evening will be devoted to further planning for the December Conference and a discussion of community organization. Two ERAP films on the community union movement will be shown and Leni Zeiger from the Chicago SDS project will speak on forthcoming poverty conference in Washington to protest inadequacy of existing government programs.

Finally, one of the most important parts of the regional conference will be the workshops on community organization and farm labor. If you are interested in these themes, attend the conference, and if possible contribute suggestions for the workshop agenda and action proposals.

Some very good SNCC & SDS articles on community organization, the war on poverty, and the role of students in building grassroots organizations will be included in the working papers for the conference.

WHERE'S CAMP COLBY?

REGIONAL MEETING

The regional steering committee meeting last Friday night was primarily devoted to a discussion of conference arrangements and the regional bulletin. It was agreed that some variety of membership bulletin should be continued and expanded, and a committee established to take the responsibility of editing and preparing the newsletter. It is clear that

the need exists for a journal, magazine, mimeoed newsletter, etc. to establish communication between SDS chapters and other student groups in the So. Cal. area - printing a calender of events, condensing news material from national movement activities, and acting as a forum for the exchange of programs and issues. One of the workshops at the conference will be devoted to publicity and a discussion of what an improved, escalated bulletin might look like.

A full regional office report will be presented at the conference - until then, speakers, resource material, films, etc. are available for the asking from the office.

Anybody interested in speaking on Vietnam or debating the right-wing groups should contact the office. A group of us are planning to work on debate tactics, speaking style, background information, etc. Many groups are asking for SDS speakers, so wouldbe orators should step forward.

The SDS study group described in the last issue of the bulletin (i.e. Bureaucratic rag) is still a reality, but we need time to develop some themes and arrange for the meetings. Saturday, sometime between the Roma Wine Boycott meeting and the Erap films would be a good time to discuss this.

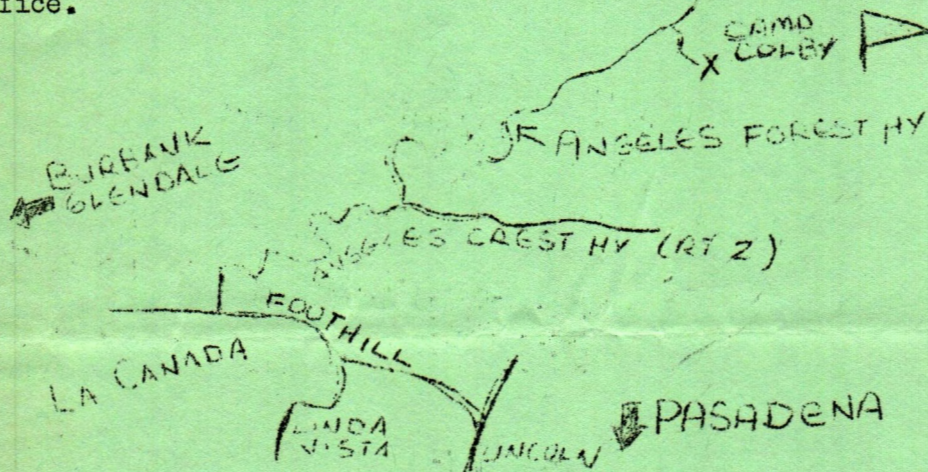

HOW TO GET THERE →

FROM LOS ANGELES, RIVERSIDE, SAN DIEGO: Follow signs on various freeways to Pasadena. Find either Lincoln Ave. or Linda Vista Ave. and proceed north until you reach Foothill Frwy. Follow that to the left until it turns into Foothill Blvd. Proceed on Foothill Blvd, until you reach Angeles Crest Highway (Rt. 2). Take Angeles Crest Highway 9 miles north to Angeles Forest Highway (Road to Palmdale). Take Angeles Forest Highway $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles to camp road, which is approximately $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles past tunnel, or a mile beyond Lee's Cafe. Take camp road $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles to camp. A prominent SDS sign will be placed at camp turnoff.

FROM SANTA BARBARA, SAN FRANCISCO: Either go to Pasadena and follow above directions, or if prefer, take Highway 101 into the L.A. area (it will turn into the Hollywood Frwy.). Get off at Santa Monica Blvd. exit and proceed east on Santa Monica until it turns into Hyperion. Follow this until you hit Canada Verdugo Blvd. which you follow to Foothill Blvd. and the Angeles Crest Highway. Use above directions for the rest. Drive carefully and don't run over any socialists.

RIDES: Cars will be leaving from the SDS office at 702 West 27th St., L.A., during Friday night and Saturday morning. If you need a ride or can take riders, call 748-9045. For out of town people who arrive early there is lodging at the SDS office.



REGISTRATION: \$1.75 per day or \$7.00 for entire conference. This simply pays the people who own the camp (the Methodist Church). We are providing food free, but in order to insure your diet bring as much extra and diverse food as you want. Everyone is expected to help prepare the meals, wash dishes, and clean the camp at one time or another.

WHAT TO BRING: Bedroll or sleeping bag, pillows, towels, soap, etc. There are accommodations for 180 in nice, heated, small cabins. One will be set aside for families. Among the camp's other miracles, it has a public address system, piano, and modern toilets. The terrain is perfect for poets, lovers, and radicals with lots of room for recreation and exploration.
