The nine kids were arrested on charges of disturbing divine worship and trespassing on church property. Their bond is \$500 on each count or \$1000 per person. They will not be bonded out before trial- their trial may be today (Monday).

The ministers have issued the following statement:

"Jesus said, 'And I, if I be lifted up, will draw all men unto me.' To exclude some of those whom Christ would draw unto himself from church on Easter, the feast of his resurrection, because of color is a violation of human dignity; it is an affront to the Christian conscience; it is a denial of the faith; it is heresy.

We are here, as Methodist Christians, to protest this denial of our Lord's resurrection. We call upon all Methodists to affirm the Lordship of the risen Christ, by welcoming to his church all who he invites."

Two others, Bishop Charles Golden (Bishop of Nashville and Mississippi) and Bishop James H. Mathews, Boston, went to Galloway Methodist Church and were turned away, but not arrested.

Hattiesburg, Miss.

The injunction in Hattiesburg governing picketing will be heard this morning in Chancery Court, Forrest County. Most likely it will be upheld. Guyot says that if the police attempt to arrest people on the picket line they will not stop picketing. Also, if there are arrests, a ~~black~~ selective buying campaign will be announced at a mass meeting tonight. Guyot does anticipate arrests.

Community people now talk of picketing as an everyday thing. At the community is divided into five areas and each area is in charge of picketing one day. The system is working very well.
